



## Layered Monogram Tray Art

### Supplies:

- Large Metal Tray
- Smaller Metal Tray
- Patterned Paper
- Burlap Ribbon
- Small Metal Flowers
- Mod Podge® & Foam Brush
- E6000 Glue®

### Directions:

1. Cut your patterned paper to fit the bottom of trays. Glue the paper in the tray using the Mod Podge® as a glue and a sealer. Use your finger to smooth out any wrinkles in the paper. Note: Mod Podge® will dry clear
2. Cut a strip of burlap ribbon to run across the large tray. Adhere it to the tray on the back side of the tray.
3. Make a loop of burlap ribbon, cinch it in the middle fasten it with a small piece of wire twisted. Glue it to the top of the tray
4. Cut a monogram letter out of the burlap and glue it to the small tray
5. Using the E6000®, glue the small tray onto the large tray & glue on the flowers
